Preparations are on the home stretch. As of this writing, there are nine mobile/portable route postings, perhaps a couple more by week's end. Most of the regulars from past years have posted plans, but a couple are unable to go mobiling this year because of surgery or other personal issues. As you probably know, much of the mobile activity is on CW, simply because usually relatively weak mobile signals can be heard by more people on CW Also, there is usually less QRM there. If you've never "been there", take a listen around 7050 kHz, or 3550 kHz later in the day. I think you'll find that it's another fascinating aspect of QSO party operation.

No doubt about it - CW operation is the "hard core" of QSO party operation, but it's not for everybody. But the neat thing about statewide parties is that there's something for everyone, all the way from serious contesting to casual QSOing and VHF operation (simplex only, please).

The big thing to remember is that we need everyone! The more stations participating, the more QSO's will be made, and that makes it more fun for everyone. Be sure to read the <u>Rules</u>, get on the air and join the party!

If you were at the last meeting, you heard about version 2.0 of the N3FJP logging program. Please upgrade if possible. If you need information on the

new version, go to the WIQP web page and look under Logging Software. There you will see how to upgrade and what the changes were. If you need help, please contact me.

And we want your log! Whether it's submitted electronically by email (<u>wiqp-logs@warac.org</u>) or sent in by snail mail, we want your log. And don't think you didn't do well enough – in the past we've received logs with just two or three QSOs. Again, if you need help, please let me know.

Besides discussion of the Party, the program at the upcoming meeting is **Digital Modes** by our resident digital expert, **Chuck Dellis, W9WLX**. Chuck plans to do a live demo.

Amateur Electronics' annual Superfest is coming up the weekend after Easter, April 5 and 6. Set aside at least one of these days to visit our local toy store. ### Wisconsin QSO Party Sunday, March 10, 2013

With the 2013 edition of our Party only a month away, preparations are in full swing. Here's what's happening.

No doubt you've already heard that we now have an Internet mailing list (a.k.a., email reflector) for WIQP. It's open to anyone interested in discussing the QSO Party, including plans for mobile and portable operating plans, ideas, suggestions or other banter about WIQP. So far, there are about 40 sign-ups. See *Join our Mailing List* on the <u>WIQP web page</u> for sign-up information. QSO parties are about working counties and we hope that all Wisconsin counties will be activated, either by mobiles passing through, portable stations, or by local hams. Northern counties are least likely to be active, so if you know or talk to hams up north, invite them to the party!

For more information on county activation, see <u>Activate All 72!</u> on the WIQP web page. The table there shows the number of fixed and mobile stations in each county based on 2011 data. That year, mobiles activated 56 counties while fixed stations activated only 42, so you can see that the mobiles are a big part of getting our Wisconsin counties on the air. Eight counties were not activated at all.

Information on Planned Mobile Routes for 2013 will be published on the web page in the next couple weeks and will be updated as more information comes in. Mobile route postings may be made on the WIQP reflector or on the <u>County Hunters</u> website, as in past years.

In January the popular N3FJP logging program for WIQP was updated with the release of version 2.0. As you may recall, there was a statement on the N3FJP website about changes in the contest rules that the program did not support. This statement is now gone. Changes include updating the Canadian province list, addition of our Beginner (Rookie) entry category, and updates to the Setup and Write Submission File screens. Instructions on how to upgrade to N3FJP version 2.0 plus Operating Tips for setting up and using the program are also on the web page. Go to <u>http://www.warac.org/wqp/wqp.htm</u> and look for Logging Software.

Another addition to the web page is tips on the use of the N1MM logger. Since this program handles many contests, it's a bit more difficult to make the proper setup selections. So please check out our N1MM Tips for WIQP if you'll be using the N1MM program.

We will want your log! Electronically (by email) if at all possible. But it doesn't matter how many Q's you make or if you have a handwritten log – we still want it. If you have questions or problems with your setup or log submission, please post your questions on the WIQP reflector or contact us at wiqp@warac.org.

Please get on the air on March 10! It's only seven hours -1:00pm to 8:00pm local time. WIQP has something for everybody, from hard-core contesters to casual "mom and pop" operation and everything in between. Do because you're a member of the sponsoring club, do it for a high score, or do it for fun but, by all means, do it!
