Following the instructions, gave you a very usable piece of equipment. Being tube equipment they are more rugged than some current equipment. (Transistors and IC circuits don't absorb electric spikes and pulses like a tube.)

Negatives might be: Not all HF ham bands are available on them. I suspect if you really wanted to operate on one of the new bands you could convert one of the bands to another. Tubes do not have the life of solid state components. Still they are available on INTERNET and swap meets and are easy to replace. The radios do require that you tune the radio to the portion of the band you are operating on. Of course that also means that the SWR isn't as much of a problem. Besides being able to spin knobs and watch needles move is some of the lost fun of operating ham radios!
