#### Club Winner

Club Honors go once again to the Fond du Lac ARC with an aggregate score of 821284 with 20 members submitting entries.

#### Analysis and Commentary

Radio conditions and weather conditions did a swap in 2013 compared to 2012. The fabulous weather of 2012 gave way to some weather more typical of March in 2013. Perhaps this is putting it too kindly. Temperatures were in the low 30's and mobiles saw some nasty wintry conditions, especially in the northwestern part of the state. More about the weather later.

Propagation conditions also experienced a reversal, fortunately in the other direction. This year the propagation gods were happy and we experienced excellent conditions by most accounts, and by the fact that new records were set in four categories. This contrasts with the unwelcome solar flare that crashed our party in 2012.

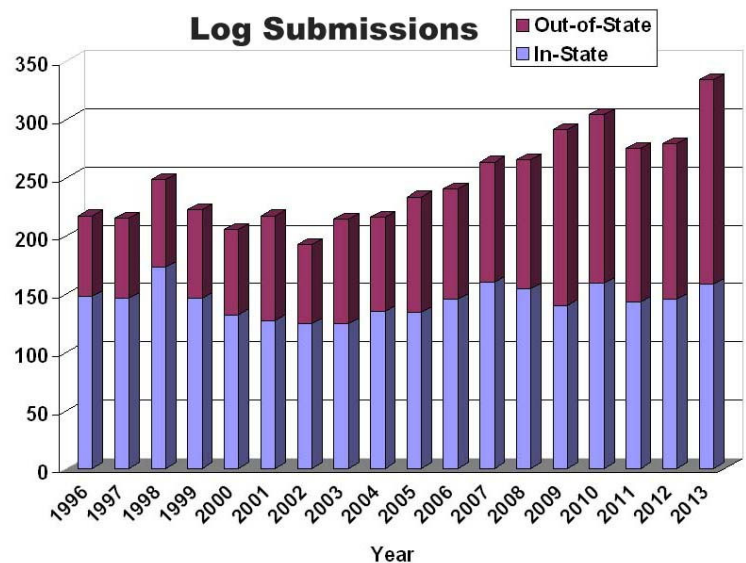
DX participation was significant with 565 Q's from 138 stations outside the U.S. and Canada showing up in logs. There was a predominance of Europeans but plenty of others, too.

#### Log Submissions

A record 334 logs were received this year, 158 from stations in Wisconsin and 176 from outside the state. In addition, there are over 600 callsigns that made at least five QSO's in the party but did not submit a log.

And of the logs we received, three had reported just one QSO and 14 reported five or fewer QSO's. Please note that no log is too small - we want them all! Thanks to all who took the time and made the effort to submit their log.

We received 21 handwritten paper logs this year, plus 11 printed computer logs. Of these 11, six were replaced with electronic logs upon request. Also, there were nine electronic logs that required additional processing.



Our log processing is now more computerized and it prefers electronic Cabrillo logs. Paper logs must be entered manually (i.e. typed in) using a spreadsheet-based entry tool that we have developed. Paper printouts of Cabrillo logs are no different - they also need to be typed in. Non-Cabrillo electronic logs can be pasted into the entry tool, so are usually easy to handle

### Single Op Rookie / Beginner (SOR)

Valerie Hotzfeld, NV9L, submitted the top score of 33197 for the Rookie category. Congratulations, Valerie, and welcome to WIQP!

Nine Rookie entries were received from Wisconsin plus five more from outside Wisconsin, including one from France. This was the fourth year WIQP has had the Beginner/Rookie category and there have been a total of 39 entries. Valerie's score puts her second in this group, with KC9POO's 2011 score of 54000 remaining as the record.

The Rookie category is open to WIQP newcomers for two consecutive years. Entrants do not need to be new hams - just new to WIQP.

### Single Op Fixed (SOF)

Ryan Klavekoske, KB9OWD, repeated his dominance of this category, taking first place for his third consecutive year. Ryan racked up 169619 points with 319 CW QSOs and 351 on phone, along with 114 mults, highest of any single op station. Congratulations, Ryan!

Not far behind with a score of 158602.5 is Todd Fonstad, N9NE. Todd is usually on the road for WIQP but operated from his fixed station this year due to recent rotator cuff surgery. He hopes to be back on the road for 2014.

Great job, guys, and thanks to you and all 126 of the SOF entries from Wisconsin stations.

### Multi-Op Fixed (MOF)

The usual contingent from the Green River Valley ARS of East Moline, Illinois made their annual pilgrimage to Wisconsin for WIQP, operating under K9WM, their club call. This year their Field Day style operation was set up in Grant county, instead of Crawford county, as they have in the past.

Club members participating were Tim Rogerwall, N9BIL; Tony Padavich, N9YPN, and Pete Beedlow, NN9K, and their score of 154892 points on 528 Q's takes the honors for the MOF category, beating out eight other stations.

Great job, guys, and thanks for trekking to Wisconsin to join the party.

### Multi-Multi Fixed (MMF)

The Eau Claire ARC, operating at the WØAIH "farm" with their club call, W9EAU, continued their dominance of the MMF category with a score of 424875 on 1593 Q's. This is the sixth year that the ECARC gang has taken this category. WIQP would not be the same without the booming signals from W9EAU. Thanks to Mark Seyffer, KB9S, and the other eight ops for their participation and support

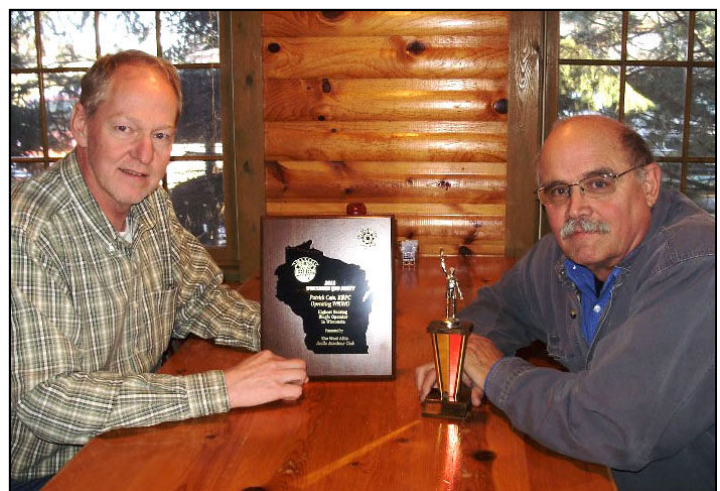

There were two other entries in this category, both new this year. Carolyn Kammen, NQ9A, along with N9CK, scored 247800 points and the Space Place Amateur Radio Center, N9UW, scored 18615 points.

### Single Op Mobile (SOM)

Pat Cain, KØPC, operating as W9DND, takes the SOM honors for the third year in a row with a record-breaking score of 219273 on 967 Q's. This score smashes the record of 183720 set in 2010 by nearly 20%! Congratulations to Pat and driver John Holman, W9DND, for their record-breaking three-peat performance!

John now holds the call of his uncle Archie "Art" Smith, W9DND, who was a very active CW traffic handler in Wisconsin for many years. Art lived in Barron, and his key be-

came silent in 1995 at the age of 92. Putting his call back on the air in WIQP has brought back memories to many Wisconsin old time CW ops. What a cool way to keep Art's memory alive!

Nipping at Pat's heels was John Baumgarten, NØIJ, with his score of 207084 on 972 Q's. Although John had five more Q's than Pat, he fell a bit short on mults with 68 vs. Pat's 73. It was great to hear John back on the road in WIQP again and hats off to him for a great effort!

NØIJ: *"Dodged the worst of the weather and managed to cover a solid block of 18 NW counties. Great credit to my driver, NXØX, who skillfully got me to the final county, Douglas, with 7 minutes to spare and just enough time to make 25 contacts."*

### Multi-Op Mobile (MOM)

The top mobile score for the day, 221652, and another record was turned in by Scott Jasper, NE9U, and his multi-op crew, Ron Fuetz, KK9K; and Art Wysocki, N9BCA. In spite of the weather and some antenna problems, Scott, Ron and Art did 859 Q's for a score of 221,652! This smashed the previous record for the MOT category by almost 20%! Great job under adverse conditions!

*"Only got to 9 of our planned 16 counties due to the weather. Roads were bad all day. Freezing rain, sleet, snow...yuk. Probably only drove 200 miles instead of our usual 350. Oh well. The good news is it seemed our piles never ended. ....Art says it was our 22nd year. It was fun having KK9K join in the fun with us. Hope all the other mobiles made it home." Scott ne9u*

### Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

Harold Burt, W9HB, and Roger Scott, KF9D, teamed up again to produce a score of 190125 points on 831 Q's (779 CW; 52 PH) and 75 mults. They drove up from Illinois and visited 18 Wisconsin counties in the process.

Harold wrote: *"The contest started and as we headed NE the fog lifted and we committed to the route. The rain came heavy at times and the road noise is louder with my new tires, so both contributed to reducing my ability to pull calls from the wonderful pile ups. There was little time to chase multipliers. The slower driving speed made for a safe trip but we ran out of contest hours with two counties left on the planned route. The home to home trip was just over 640 miles and 14 hours."*

Thanks again, Harold and Roger, for your participation in WIQP.

### Single Op Technician (SOT)

There were just two Technician class entries this year. Both were Single Op Techs, Justin Kurscheidt, KC9HYC and Francis Lefeber, KC9PSO. Justin was top dog with his score of 513 on 38 Q's and 9 mults. There were no entries in the Multi-Op Tech category.

The decline of Tech participation in recent years is puzzling. There used to be a hotbed of Tech activity, especially in the Fox Valley area. This kind of VHF participation in a state QSO party was unique to Wisconsin and it's disappointing to see it fade. What can be done to rejuvenate it?

### Top Non-Wisconsin Single-Op

This year's honors go to Dan Karg, K0TI, for his score of 41976, the highest score for a single-op station outside of Wisconsin. Dan did 288 Q's and 66 mults from his QTH in Woodbury, Minnesota, just southeast of the Twin Cities.

Thanks to all of the participants from outside Wisconsin! There were 169 entrants from outside Wisconsin

### Club Competition

The Fond du Lac club maintained their dominance of the club competition with a score of 821284 contributed by 20 members. Big contributors to their score were SOF winner Ryan, KB9OWD, and Jeff, W9MSE, who mobiled through 11 counties.

The club competition award is open to Wisconsin-based clubs only. Many WIQP entrants are members of regional clubs or clubs based in other states. Society of Midwest Contesters (16 WIQP entrants) and the Minnesota Wireless Association (19 entrants) are examples. A big thanks to all clubs, in and out of Wisconsin, that contribute to the success of our



Party!

**Weather**

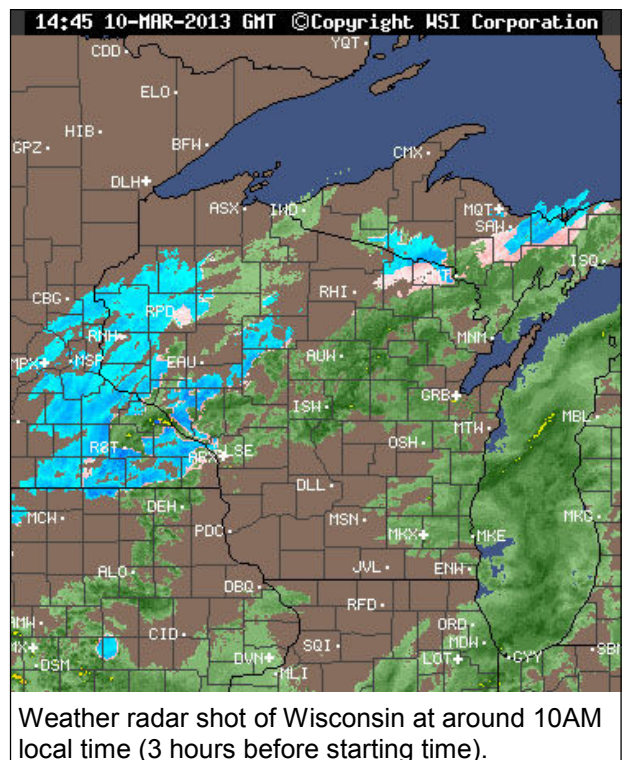
The weather affected mobile operations significantly. Routes were shortened because of lower average speeds and because of uncertainty about road conditions ahead.

Surprisingly, all northern counties were activated in spite of the weather. The only two counties not activated - Crawford and Richland - are in the southwestern part of the state where fog, not slippery stuff, was the main deterrent.

Scott, NE9U, and his Multi-Op Mobile crew had an interesting (now, probably not then) weather situation. On Sunday morning he wrote:

*“Well, looks like winter storm moving into western Wisconsin late in contest so we are changing our route so we don't get caught in it. (assuming we can get out of my cabin in Florence County).....hills are still glare ice and we are waiting for the sand truck to sand them.....”*

Looking at Sunday morning’s weather radar map QSL’s this - it looks like Scott and his crew had their own special patch of frozen precipitation centered on Florence county.

**Editorial**

It's been said many times that mobiles are the main attraction of state QSO parties. This is true in so many ways. Traveling through 15-20 counties or more while maintaining a rates of well over 100 Q's per hour is nothing short of fantastic. Personally, I stand in awe of their skill and ability. Plus there's the time and personal resources spent preparing for and driving hundreds of miles.

But as important as mobiles are to the Party, there is so much more. Yes, we spend a lot of time and effort talking about high scores and winning numbers, and this is as it should be. There's competition involved.

However, if you count all the mobiles and all the category winners, there are no more than two dozen callsigns. It's the rest of the participants, hundreds of them, that make a QSO party (or any contest) what it is. From feedback we get, it seems that one of the special things about the WIQP is that we have a lot of stations to work, many of whom are casual participants. So one of our major goals is to expand the participant base. We need your help! Talk up our Party and encourage more people to join in!
