WIQP 2015

In a nutshell, this year's WIQP enjoyed good propagation conditions and good weather. Participation was down a bit and scores reflected that with no new records being set. There was also competition from the Wisconsin - Michigan State basketball game on Sunday afternoon, right in the middle of our contest. Scott, NE9U, sums it up very well:

The weather was balmy for Wisconsin.... good for the mobiles...bad for participation. It also didn't help that the biggest most exciting Wisconsin Badger basketball game of the year was on TV....I think that kept a lot of casual operators out of the shack...

Temperatures were in the 50's over most of the state so roads were good for mobiling, aside from the usual spring potholes. And by the way, UW won the game 80 - 69 in overtime.

Log submissions were 285 for 2015, down about 13% from last year. 138 (48%) of these came from stations operating in Wisconsin while 147 came from stations outside the state, with 7 of those from DX stations. These logs contained a little over 37000 entries compared to 41000 last year. There was participation from all 50 US states and seven Canadian entities.

Personally, my sense of how things went this year is altered because I spent this WIQP mobiling in northeastern counties with old high school buddy Bill, K9BTP, rather than at my Milwaukee home station as in past years. A great experience, but lots of noise and RFI problems to conquer for 2016.

County Activation

Logs were received from 69 of our 72 counties, with Door, Iron and Kewaunee not heard from directly, but other logs show that there definitely was activity in all three. Curiously, other stations reported 169 Q's with three different stations in Kewaunee county, but none of these three stations submitted their log. Other stations reported 42 Q's with four stations in Door county and 7 Q's with one mobile station passing through Iron county.

Category Results

Single Op Rookie (SOR)

For the second year running, Richard Collins, KB9NIV, in Vilas county submitted the top Rookie score of 34272 points, improving his 2014 score by over 6000 points. Congratulations, Richard. You're off to a good start and we hope to see you in another category next year.

Ten Rookie entries were received from Wisconsin this year, down from 15 last year. Seven entries were received from outside Wisconsin, down from five last year.

The purpose of the Rookie category is, as the name implies, to encourage newcomers to get involved and join the fun. Entrants do not need to be new hams - just new to WIQP. This category is open newcomers for two consecutive years and all entrants in this category get a certificate.

Single Op Fixed (SOF)

Chad Kurszewski, WE9V, once again took top honors in this category with 185022 points, down about 10% from his 2014 performance. Congratulations, Chad!

Again this year, a fixed station has produced the highest single-op score. For seven years prior to last year, the highest single-op score was produced by a mobile station. While SOF and SOM do not compete directly and receive separate plaques, it is still interesting to compare them

Runner-up in the SOF category, with a score of 114807, is Mike Lawrence, K9UA of Winnebago county. Congratulations, Mike!

Great job, guys, and thanks to all 97 of the SOF entries from Wisconsin stations.

Multi-Op Fixed (MOF)

Tim Rogerwall, N9BIL, and his group of ops from Illinois returned to Grant county this year and took top honors in the MOF category again as they did two years ago. Their group of five ops (NN9K, N9BIL, N9YPN, W9PC, KD9VT) scored 96808.5 points.

The team of Kent Scheuerell, K9ZMU, and his son Scott Scheuerell, N9HDE, also operating from Grant county, came in second with 59131.5 points.

Congratulations, gentlemen, and thanks to you and the other five MOF entries for your efforts!

Multi-Multi Fixed (MMF)

No clean sweep this year, but the Eau Claire ARC, W9EAU, continued their dominance of the MMF category with a score of 371574 on 1484 QSO's. Most scores were down this year, but the W9EAU gang upped their numbers considerably over last year's 267375 on 981 Q's, even though they were unable to collect two of our 72 counties. Great work for, by far, the highest score in the whole party.

Thanks to Mark Seyffer, KB9S, along with W0AIH, K1OF, K0TG, WB9NTO, N0KD, KB9WPC, KB9AZZ and KG0KM for your participation and support.

Other entries in this category were Carolyn Kammen, NQ9A, along with N9CK, scored 174075 points. The remaining three entries in this category are club stations: the Green Bay Mike and Key Club (K9KL), 146353.5 points; West Allis RAC (W9FK), 87223.5 points and Madison's Four Lakes ARC (N9UW) with 63081 points.

Single Op Mobile (SOM)

The last two years, Scott Jasper, NE9U, and friends Ron Feutz, KK9K, and Art Wsocki, N9BCA, took to the road as a multi-op mobile operation and took first place in the MOM category on both outings. This year, Ron and Art both were unable to participate due to family illnesses, so Scott operated solo with driver Al, N9ISN. And guess what - he took first place in the SOM category! Scott and Al scored 203600 points on 859 Q's while passing through 16 counties. Congratulations, Scott!

Runner-up in this category is long-time WIQP mobile competitor Jeff Bechner, W9MSE, with 189708 points on 814 Q's from 18 counties.

W9DND/mobile, operated by Pat Cain, K0PC and driven by John Holman, W9DND, came in third this year with 185328 points on 812 QSO's while visiting 15 counties.

Shortly before 2015 WIQP, Pat made this announcement on the WIQP email reflector:

The 2015 WI QSO Party will be the last for the duo of W9DND & K0PC. John, W9DND, is retiring from the QSO Party Driver game after this event. I want to thank John for hauling me around MN, WI, & IA for over ten years. We have had some great success over the years and hope to go out with a bang (metaphorical, not literal).

Pat and John's mobile efforts have dominated WIQP's SOM category for four years prior to this year and they hold our all-time highest SOM score of 219273 points in 2013. We hope that Pat can team up with a new driver and can continue to visit to Wisconsin each year on the second full weekend in March.

Fourteen mobiles entered the SOM category this year, up from nine in 2014. The effort, skill and personal resources that go into QSO Party mobile operations is truly awesome, and it is greatly appreciated. Thank you so much for doing what you do.

Multi-Op Mobile (MOM)

The top Multi-Op Mobile score was turned in by Jim Callow, K8IR, and Eric Janssen, KG9GH, who accumulated 120875 points. They toured 10 counties and logged 569 Q's for their efforts.

Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

Bill Mitchell, AE0EE, and Matt Holden, K0BBC, came over from Minnesota to enter this category and scored 74210 points for their efforts. They visited 11 counties (10 for bonus) and amassed 403 Q's.

Thanks again, guys, for your participation in WIQP.

Single Op Technician (SOT) and Multi-Op Technician (MOT)

No entries were received in either of the Tech categories (SOT nor MOT) this year. Perhaps the new VHF plaque will provide more incentive for VHF activity going forward.

Top Non-Wisconsin Single-Op

This year's out-of-state honors and a plaque again go to Dan Karg, K0TI, of Woodbury, MN for his score of 44622 on 289 Q's. Dan took this category in 2013 with 41976 points and placed fifth last year with 38610 points.

Thanks to all non-Wisconsin participants for coming to our party!

Top QRP Station

This year's QRP honors were taken by Dan Alwin, KE0G, who came over from Minnesota and operated QRP mobile in three counties in western Wisconsin. Dan did 72244 points on 239 Q's.

Dan came in second in the QRP scoring last year. Enjoy your plaque, Dan, and thanks for your participation.

Overall, logs were received from 14 stations that operated QRP this year, 8 in Wisconsin and 6 out of state.

Top VHF Station

The top score above 50Mhz was turned in by Brian Long, KB9LRD, who accumulated 3584 points on 66 VHF QSO's with 16 mults. Brian was mobile and visited seven counties with enough Q's for bonus points in four of them. Nice job, Brian.

In all, 33 stations competed for the VHF plaque. Scoring for this award is done by applying normal WIQP scoring rules while ignoring all QSO's below 50 MHz.

Club Competition

The Fond du Lac club maintained their dominance of the club competition with a score of 806790.5 contributed by 22 club members. Big contributors to their score were mobiles Jeff, W9MSE, and Todd, N9NE, as well as Mike, N9UA, all with over 100000 points.

The Madison area's Four Lakes Amateur Radio Club, with seven members contributing their scores, takes second place honors with 393316 points.

The club competition award is open to Wisconsin-based clubs only. Many WIQP entrants are members of regional clubs or clubs based in other states. Society of Midwest Contesters (20 WIQP entrants) and the Minnesota Wireless Association (20 entrants) are examples. A big thanks to all clubs, in and out of Wisconsin, that contribute to the success of our Party!

A total of 68 different club affiliations show up in the logs submitted this year.

Log Submissions

Of the 285 logs received, 22 were paper logs, of which half were handwritten and half were computer printouts. Of the 11 computer printed logs, five were received electronically upon request, so a total of 17 had to be entered manually. Although the number of paper logs received gets smaller every year, it still takes a significant effort for us to enter them into our database. If your log is already in a computer, please make the extra effort to email it to us. Please contact us if you need help with this.

More about Mobiles

A total of 19 mobiles traveled Wisconsin highways this year, up from 14 last year. At least one mobile visited 63 of our 72 counties and 27 counties had no logs submitted other than by mobile stations, so it's obvious that mobiles are a big part of county activation. Thank you, mobiles!

An interesting sidelight is to look at fixed stations that made the most Q's with mobiles in WIQP. It seems that a few

stations really focus on working as many mobiles in as many counties as possible. It's also interesting that stations outside Wisconsin do very well in this regard, with NA0N in Minnesota and N2CU in New York topping the list this year. In 2014, Laci, OM2VL, in the Slovak Republic placed 4th in this list with 63 mobile Q's.

Overall Activity

As you can see from the table below, WIQP activity is down the last two years and we wonder why. First, it's apparent

that 2013 was a phenomenal year for propagation on our three main bands, 20, 40 and 80. Also, rather wintry weather conditions that year perhaps discouraged outdoor activities resulting in more ops in the shack. In 2015, it seems that 20 and 80 failed to live up to expectations and 40 picked up some of this difference. Also, it was a decent spring day weather-wise, so this no-doubt had some effect as well. And who knows how many were drawn away by the basketball game?
