2020 Results



Summary

Participation was up a lot, based on the record-breaking number of logs received and the total number of log entries was also up significantly. This year's propagation conditions continued the trend we've seen the last three years, with in-state propagation on 40 limited at best and 80 meters being the bread-and-butter band. Long propagation seemed to be better with some European participation showing up again after a year's absence. Weather was good for Wisconsin – no snow. Temps were a bit above freezing.

WIQP 2020

Log submissions for 2020 pegged the meter! We received 446 logs, over 100 more than ever received from past parties. The old record was 332 in 2018. Wisconsin stations submitted 158 logs this year, a dozen more than last year for an increase of 8.2%. But we received 288 logs from out-of-state participants for a 75% increase over 2019's 165 logs, so the lion's share of the increased log submission came from non-Wisconsin stations.

Perhaps this increase was at least partially due to the onset of the COVID-19 lockdown that descended upon us in mid-March. Another factor could be the new State QSO Party challenge. No matter what, we're happy to have the increased participation and hope that everyone had a good time and will be back next year!

County Activation

Logs were received from 65 of our 72 counties, a little better than last year's 63. Most of the missing counties were in the northern tier and just below that. In recent years, these counties have depended on mobiles passing through to activate them, and that didn't happen in these counties this year. We need local hams to be more active! Based on QSO's in other logs, there was some activity in five of the seven "missing" counties but Iron and Sawyer counties show no sign of activity.

In 2020, 18 counties were activated only by mobiles, up a bit from 14 last year but still down from 27 in 2018. Hopefully this is because more local hams are participating. Overall, mobile QSOs were reported in 50 counties, so their contribution is very significant. Thanks to everyone who makes the extra effort to get on the road for our party!

As in recent years, WIQP county activation data will be put on the website after the results are published.

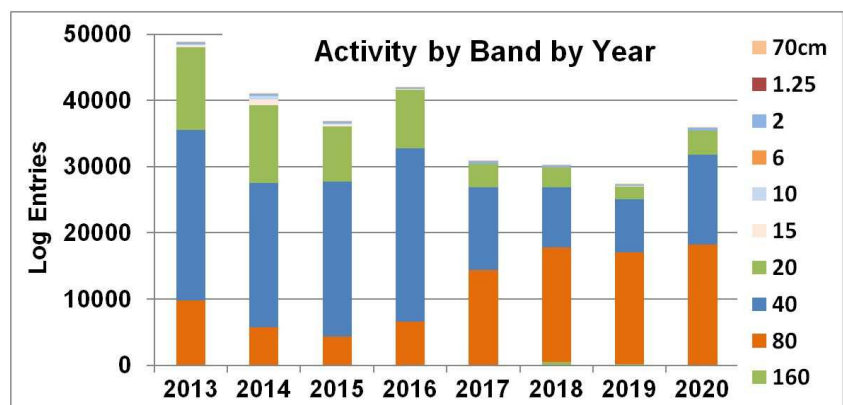
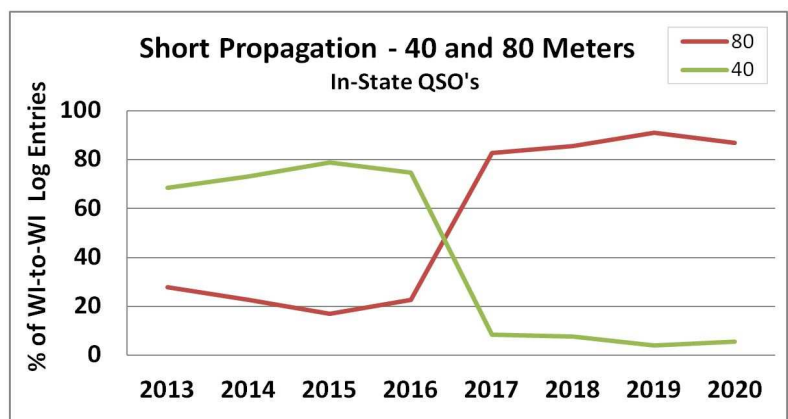
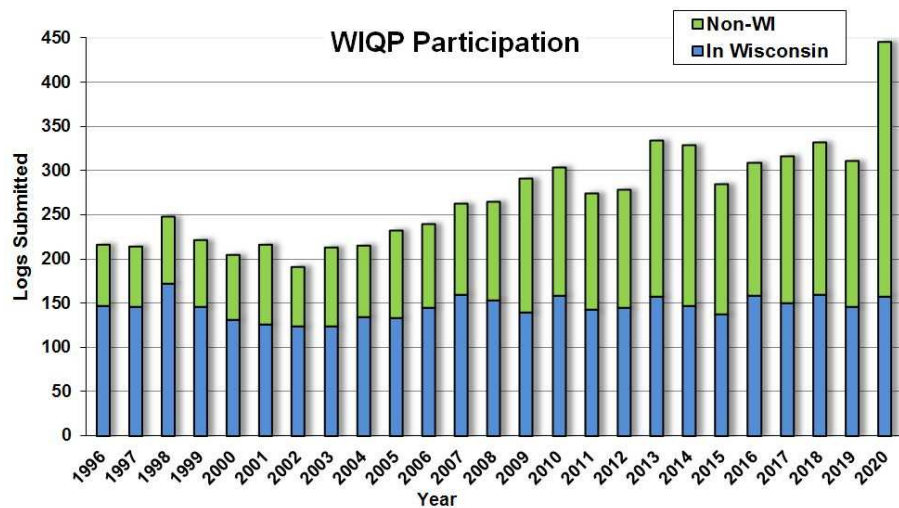
Activity by Band

In the days before this year's event, there was reflector discussion about getting on 80 meters early because 40 will be long from the get-go. This advice was right on the money and the graph at right clearly shows this. This was the fourth year of the long-40 phenomenon since we first experienced it in 2017.

So the big question is: will we have such a dramatic shift back to short-40 as sunspot cycle 25 builds? And when?

The Activity by Band chart to the right shows the number of log entries and how they break down by band. The increased number of entries for 2020 is a result of the big increase in the number of logs.

It's interesting to note that logs are



getting smaller. Since 2016, the average number of QSO's per log has gone from 135 down to 80.

Category Results

Single Op Rookie (SOR)

Eleven Rookie logs were received from Wisconsin stations this year compared to five last year. Six Rookie logs were received from outside the state.

This year's top Rookie is Fred Glenn, K9SO, in western Kenosha county, with 51408 points on 478 CW and phone Q's. The second place Rookie is Fred Schwierske, W9KEY, of Cedarburg in Ozaukee County. Fred scored 26244 points on 486 phone QSO's.

Thanks to all the Rookies for entering WIQP! We hope you had fun and will be back next year.

The Rookie category, as the name implies, is to encourage newcomers to get involved and join the fun. Entrants do not need to be new hams - just new to WIQP. The Rookie category is available to new entrants for two consecutive years – see Rules for details. All entrants in this category get a certificate.

Single Op Fixed (SOF)

The top scores in this category were turned in by the same stations that took top spots in 2019. Chad Kurszewski, WE9V, in Kenosha county once again takes the top spot with 178975 points on 715 total Q's. Runner-up is Scott Dawley, N9SD, who operated from the Milwaukee lakefront this year. Scott accrued 128128 points on 593 Q's for his efforts.

Congratulations Chad and Scott, and thanks to all 125 SOF entries from Wisconsin stations.

Multi-Op Fixed (MOF)

Husband/wife team of Joe and Linda Mayenschein, WB9SBD and KA9CHM, operating W9ET as the Driftless Zone Contesters took the top spot in this category with 39658 points on 249 QSO's. Linda and Joe are located near LaValle in Sauk County.

Second place in this category goes to another husband/wife team, Donna and Gil Van Blaricom, WB9TFF and WB9TFH, with 15025.5 points on 127 Q's. They operated portable from Redgranite in Waushara County this year.

Congratulations to both of the above groups and thanks to all six MOF entries for your efforts!

Multi-Multi Fixed (MMF)

There was just one entry in this category this year and it was Tyler Letlebo, N9WLF, plus his crew, Jason Christensen, K9MUR, and Brian Bodette, KD9MQN. Operating from Adams County, they accumulated 2580 points on forty QSO's.

Single-Op Mobile (SOM)

There were seven Single-Op mobiles this year and one each MOM and MMM.

Two mobiles came over from Minnesota this year and produced nearly identical scores, but with differing strategies. Jon Platt, W0ZQ, won this category with 128637.5 points, barely beating Pat Cain, K0PC, with his 128116 points. Jon visited seven counties with a mostly rover-style operation while Pat covered 17 counties while operating in-motion.

Their nearly identical scores were achieved with very different numbers. Pat has 115 more QSO's but Jon but has 15 more mults. Jon started in EAU and went along the Mississippi counties, ending in Pierce. Pat started in PIE and went southeast as far as Green Lake, then looped back northwestward, ending up in CHI.

Gentlemen, thank you for coming to Wisconsin!

Multi-Op Mobile (MOM) and Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

Scott Jasper, NE9U, and his sidekick Al Schlaugat, N9ISN, ran Multi-Op Mobile and scored 142292 points (163687 last year) with 653 Q's on CW and six on phone for a total of 659 Q's. They went southward from FLO to OCO then west to DUN, for a total of 14 counties.

As mentioned on the first page, a rules change this year awards the Top Wisconsin Mobile plaque to the top

single-transmitter mobile station. As a result, the Top Wisconsin Mobile plaque goes to the NE9U team this year. Congratulations Scott and Al!

And, in his soapbox, Scott says, "I've lost count but this was close to our 30th year going mobile." Scott, thanks for your contributions to WIQP activity over those years!

Multi-Multi Mobile (MMM)

Three members of the Northeast Wisconsin Amateur Radio Club, renamed from Fox Valley Amateur Radio Contesters in 2019, ran Multi-Multi Mobile under their club callsign, K9TIT. A three-man crew of Tim Hale, KC9FSH, Andy Skjoldager, KC9IZF, and Scott Burg, WE9U, teamed up to produce 28664 points on 272 phone QSOs. They did a loop through ten counties in eastern Wisconsin in the Green Bay/Fox Valley area and northwest.

Top Non-Wisconsin Single-Op

This year's out-of-state honors and the Top Non-WI plaque go Mark Wilson, K1RO, in western New Hampshire. Mark scored 20632 points on 212 Q's. David Pritchard, W9QL, in northeastern Illinois is this year's runner-up with 20278 points on 187 QSO's.

As mentioned earlier, the number of logs from outside Wisconsin were way up this year – 288 compared to 159 in 2019. Thanks to all non-Wisconsin participants for coming to our Party! C'mon back next year!

Top QRP Station

This year's QRP honors and the QRP plaque go last year's second place finisher, Joel Kluender, W9JFK, in Grant county. He earned 49476 points on 206 QSO's, mostly on CW. Second place goes to Gary Van Ryzin, W9HM, in Outagamie County. Gary scored 15000 points on 80 Q's.

Overall, logs were received from 12 stations that operated QRP, compared to 10 last year. Five are from out of state.

Top VHF Station

The top single-op score above 50 MHz was turned in by Brian Long, KB9LRD/ mobile, who collected 112 VHF QSO's and 11 mults for 5348 VHF points during his travels through 8 counties in the east-central part of the state.

Second place goes to a multi-multi mobile group, the Northeast Wisconsin ARC, K9TIT, with 540 points on 45 Q's and six mults. A third station scored over 500 VHF points, Karen McDonald, KC9BMH, in Outagamie County.

So the VHF plaque goes to Brian, KB9LRD, who had well above the 500 point minimum required for this plaque.

This year 44 stations reported VHF/UHF QSO's, seven more than last year. And top scores were substantially higher as well. VHF activity has been slipping the last few years, so we're glad to see a rebound this year..

Club Competition

The Ozaukee Radio Club takes top honors in the club competition this year with an aggregate score of 344596.5points contributed by 12 members. Top scorers in the land of Oz were Gary, W9XT, and Vic, WT9Q.

The second place club is our own West Allis Radio Amateur Club with 213089 points contributed by 14 members. Top scorers from WARAC were Al, WA9BZW, and Mike, WO9B, who did a rover-style mobile run this year.

Thanks to clubs in and out of Wisconsin for promoting WIQP to their members. Keep up the good work in the future!

W9FK Bonus

The West Allis club call, W9FK, was activated again by Phil Gural, W9NAW, this time from Iowa County. Phil's portable operation made 185 phone QSO's for 18870 points. Note that the W9FK activity is listed under "WARAC Bonus Station – W9FK" in the club listing and is not included in the West Allis Club aggregate.

Thanks to Phil for being W9FK for a day.

Log Submissions

This year we added the option to submit logs via WA7BNM Cabrillo Web Forms. This is useful for entrants who used paper logging or logging software that doesn't produce a Cabrillo file. 36 entrants submitted their logs this way. We were down to 15 paper logs, so this alternative clearly saved us some effort. Thanks to Bruce, WA7BNM, for making this option available.
